



Based on the information provided, the Tribe has concerns that the project could impact known cultural resources. Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation highly recommends including cultural monitors during development and ground disturbance. In addition, we recommend cultural sensitivity training for any pre-project personnel to be added to the permit as a condition of approval. We also request that you incorporate Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation's Treatment Protocol into the mitigation measures for this project. Please submit the updated mitigation measures to the Cultural Resources Department once completed.

HELIX Environmental Planning, Inc. (HELIX) has contracted with the Gidaro Group, LLC, in support of the proposed Dixon 257 Development Project (Project) located within the City of Dixon, within Solano County, CA. The Project occupies Assessor's Parcel Numbers 0111-010, 020, 030, 040, and 0111-080-050, and encompasses a total of roughly 257 acres. The Project is bounded by Pedrick Road and agricultural lands to the east, designated industrial lands to the north and south, and lands designated as regional commercial and industrial to the west. A search of the Native American Heritage Commission's (NAHC) Sacred Lands File returned negative results, and the NAHC suggested we contact you for information regarding Native American Resources in or near the Project Area. The Project location is depicted on the enclosed map for your reference.

The Project Area will be developed into a mixed-use Campus to foster job growth and easy access to the regional transportation network in the area. Project plans call for the use of +/- 47.4 acres for a Technology Campus (near the north end of the site) to provide direct access to the Professional Drive extension that will connect to Pedrick Road, +/- 10 acres for a High-Density Residential area (located with direct access to Perick Road and contiguous to the Tech Campus, and adjacent residential areas), +/- 142.6 acres for a Low-Density Residential area (within the southern portion of the Project Area), +/- 13.4 acres for parks, +/- 1.6 acres for a well site, +/- 25.1 acres for a basin (within the Project Area's southeastern corner), and +/- 22 acres for Rights of Way. While current property access consists of Pedrick Road along the eastern boundary of the site, as part of the City of Dixon's Northeast Quadrant Specific Plan, a future 4-lane arterial (Professional Drive) will be developed along the site's western and northern boundaries. A planned extension of Dorset Drive will also connect to Professional Drive near the center of the Technology campus to provide direct visual and vehicular pedestrian connectivity to the commercial and industrial uses currently under development west of the Project Area.

If there are sensitive resources within or near the proposed Project Area that could be impacted by Project development, please advise us accordingly.
